Historical Grades and Transcript Legends

CGU's grading systems and transcript legends have changed over time. Prior to 2010, complete grading legends were printed directly on official transcripts. Due to space limitations, transcripts issued after 2010 include an abbreviated legend. The information below is provided for historical reference.

June 2010 – August 2021

January 1995 – May 2010

Note: Courses numbered below 100 did not receive graduate credit.

September 1974 – December 1994

Grade	Meaning
PI	Permanent Incomplete (effective January 1991)

Note: After September 1972, courses numbered below 200 received graduate credit only if followed by an X. Non-credit courses were designated with a Y. Prior to September 1972, courses numbered 1–100 received graduate credit only if followed by an asterisk (*).
